OVERVIEW

THIS WEEK

Zimbabwe has been mobilising resources to respond to the devastating socio-economic effects of the coronavirus. The Zimbabwe COVID-19 Resource Tracker is a civil society initiative by ZIMCODD to keep track of all resources pledged, received and utilised by Government.

ZIMCODD notes with concern that accountability for these resources is equally important as the resources themselves. This tracker, which is updated weekly, empowers citizens with information to hold Government to account on allocation and utilisation of COVID-19 resources.

MAJOR CONCERNS

- Citizens bemoan the upsurge in the number of cases vis-à-vis the poor enforcement of COVID-19 preventive measures in Zimbabwe.
- Citizens are concerned about the alleged corruption, resource leakages, abuses and mismanagement of COVID-19 earmarked resources.
- Another cause for concern is the flouting of procurement procedures by public officials in COVID-19 related procurement.
- Citizens also condemn the lack of transparency and accountability in COVID-19 resource allocation and expenditure.

RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE GOVERNMENT

• Intensify COVID-19 screening and testing to generate data which inform key decisions to

strengthen response mechanism in the country based on COVID-19 progression.

- Improve conditions and prevention measures in COVID-19 quarantine centres.
- Strengthen COVID-19 preventive measures for the general public.
- Ensure all COVID-19 procurement is guided competitive and open bidding processes.
- Publish all COVID-19 related contracts and beneficial ownership of companies awarded the contracts.

• For all COVID-19 money, regularly publish actual funds received and outstanding pledges.
