OVERVIEW

Zimbabwe has been trying to mobilise resources to respond in the best way possible to the devastating social and economic efects of corona virus. The Zimbabwe COVID-19 resource tracker is a civil society initiative by ZIMCODD to keep track of all resources pledged, received and utilised by the government of Zimbabwe in the COVID-19 response. ZIMCODD notes with concern that accountability for these resources is equally imporant as the resources themselves. This tracker has been developed to strengthen transparency and accountability by the government on COVID-19 resources while empowering citizens with information to hold the government to account on allocation and utilisation of COVID-19 resources. The tracker is updated on a weekly basis to show pledges honoured, resources received and resources expended.



MAJOR CONCERNS

- Citizens have bemoaned the impact of COVID-19 on food security as they fail to provide basic food stuffs for their families in the face of hyperinflation and joblessness. United Nations notes that Zimbabwe is facing a severe hunger crisis in 2020, with over 60% of the population i.e. 8.6million people food insecure, the majority of whom are in urban areas.
- Following the launch of the Budget Strategy Paper (BSP) on 16th October, citizens bemoan the manner in which the 2021 BSP is silent and does not provide guidelines on how the government will mobilise resources towards alleviating COVID-19 impacts.
- Citizens are concerned about government's lack of transparency on where COVID-19 earmarked money is going, how much is being spent and addressing which priorities.
- As such, citizens' right to healthcare continues to be under threat in the light of the COVID-19 second wave.

RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE GOVERNMENT

- The 2021 national budget must make a clear and strong commitment to reduce hunger and food insecurity, a situation which was further worsened by the COVID-19 pandemic.
- The Budget Strategy Paper must make a provision for addressing socio-economic impacts of COVID-19. It therefore follows
 that, clear guidelines should be made to allow the government to mobilise resources to try and adequately respond to the
 emerging COVID-19 induced shocks and vulnerabilities that citizens are experiencing.
- To ensure public accountability, the government should develop and implement clear public resource monitoring mechanisms
 that will minimize resource leakages, and ensure that COVID-19 resources reach all the intended beneficiaries particularly the
 disadvantaged and marginalised.
- As COVID-19 resources continue trickling in, the government must channel COVID-19 funds towards improving public healthcare. PPEs remain central in the COVID-19 fight to flatten the curve.
