

C: VID-19 RESOURCE TRACKER

OVERVIEW

The second wave of COVID-19 is hitting had in the country with a spike in infection and death cases. Zimbabwe like other countries, has continued to put in place measures to curail the spread of COVID-19 and to avvert the ects of the pandemic on the economy and its citizens. As such, from the 5th of January 2021, Zimbabwe entered into a 30-day level 4 lockdown, to curb the spread of the pandemic. Zimbabwe continues to mobilise resources internally and externally to respond to the devastating socioeconomic efects of COVID-19 in the best way possible. Among other efoos, the government in the 2021 national budget has set aside ZWL7 billion to recruit more health personnel, procure PPEs, testing kits and sundries required in fig. ting COVID-19. The government has also budgeted ZWL3.5billion to cushion 500 000 vulnerable households whose beneficiaries c. mprise the informal sector, returning residents and children living in the streets. The COVID-19 resources tracker is a ZIMCODD initiative to keep track of all resources pledged, received and utilised by the Government of Zimbabwe in response to the COVID-19 pandemic from March 2020 to date. The aim of the COVID-19 resources Tracker is to strengthen transparency and accountability by the government on COVID-19 resources while empowering citizens with information to hold the government to account on allocation and utilisation of COVID-19 resources. The tracker is updated on a weekly basis to show pledges honoured, resources received and resources expended.



MAJOR CONCERNS

The government is commended for launching its COVID-19 vaccination programme on 18 February 2021 and has since embarked on the decentralised distribution and administration of the vaccines to healthcare professionals in pursuit of the 10 million citizens herd immunity goal. However, the following key issues of concern continue to be worrisome:

- Public procurement processes are particularly vulnerable to corruption and resource leakages in Zimbabwe. This is evidenced by the case involving the Principal Director of Epidemiology and Disease Control, Dr. Portia Manangazira. It is alleged that Dr. Manangazira illegally facilitated the recruitment and training of 28 family members as Community Health Workers and authorized the procurement of goods worth US\$280 529 without following due process. Dr. Manangazira allegedly misappropriated funds and fuel meant for training 800 community health workers who were to raise awareness on COVID-19 in the country.
- With the vaccination programme already underway, lack of clear plan and timelines as to when the rest of the citizens are going to be inoculated is worrying.
- Zimbabwean roads have been declared a state of disaster. As such, it remains curious how the COVID-19 vaccines will be distributed to remote areas where road networks have been rendered inaccessible.
- While the government prepares for the inevitable reopening of schools, it is worrying that citizens have not been consulted and updated on
 the state of preparedness, and precautionary measures that are being put in place by government to ensure that pandemic does not spread in
 schools.

RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE GOVERNMENT

- The Office of the President and Cabinet (OPC) should demonstrate the political will to eradicate corruption and mismanagement of public funds. There must, therefore, be greater commitment and action from OPC which goes beyond the anti-corruption rhetoric.
- Prosecution of a high profile figures is necessary to set precedence and deter future malfeasance behaviour.
- There is also need to reform the public service recruitment processes to insulate against nepotism. Stronger Parliamentary oversight and monitoring of major contracts and procurement processes is vital is safeguarding COVID-19 resources.
- A clear vaccine roll-out strategy that ensures inclusivity and accessibility of the vaccine by all should be devised to ensure
 achievement of a just vaccination programme for all. As such, all national accountability institutions and institutions
 already deployed in the mitigation of COVID-19 should work together for this to be achievable.
- There is need for the government to work with relevant stakeholders in ensuring that necessary measures are put in place before the reopening of schools. It is also important for the government to allocate more resources towards ensuring that the poorest districts and provinces are safe for both the learners and teachers.
