

FVD-19 RESOURCE TRACKER

OVERVIEW

The COVID-19 Resource tracker is a ZIMCODD initiative to keep track of all resources pledged, received and expended by the Government of Zimbabwe in response to the COVID-19 pandemic from March 2020 to date. The aim of the COVID-19 Resources Tracker is to strengthen transparency and accountability by the government on COVID-19 resources while empowering citizens with information to hold the government to account for the allocation and utilisation of COVID-19 resources. The tracker is updated on a weekly basis.

Zimbabwe continues to mobilise resources internally and externally to respond to the devastating socioeconomic effects of COVID-19. Among other efforts, the government in the 2021 national budget has set aside ZWL7 billion to recruit more health personnel, procure PPEs, testing kits and sundries required in fighting COVID-19. The government has also budgeted ZWL3.5billion to cushion 500 000 vulnerable households whose beneficiaries comprise of members in the informal sector, returning residents and children living on the streets. On 18 February 2021, the Government through the Ministry of Health and Child Care launched the vaccination program and as at 26 July 2021, a total of 1 491 493 Zimbabweans had been inoculated.



This has widened the inequality gap between the rich and the poor as the poor haven't received significant cushioning from the government.

- As the COVID-19 crisis continues with cases hovering at a staggering 2030 new cases per day (on average in the last 7 days) and deaths soaring at a daily average of 68, it is worrisome that the government hasn't done enough to raise COVID-19 vaccine awareness to increase vaccine uptake.
- Citizens also bemoan that major hospitals are becoming overwhelmed to admit COVID-19 patients
 as more people are in need of hospitalisation. This points to the fact that very little has been done to
 increase the capacity of public health institutions and resultantly citizens are being denied access to
 public healthcare services, contrary to the dictates of the constitution.

RECOMMENDATIONS.

- Government to intervene meaningfully into the crisis and avail resources from its budget surpluses to cushion vulnerable groups of the society, some of whom have not received food, cash aid or even PPEs since the advent of COVID-19 in Zimbabwe.
- The government must channel resources towards mounting a strong COVID-19 vaccination campaign to challenge and factually dispute COVID-19 vaccine conspiracies to increase vaccine uptake. Community Health Workers should be revived and incentivised to provide this information from the village or cell level to increase public trust and vaccine acceptance.
- The government must institute measures geared towards recovering the loot from public officials
 who have misappropriated COVID-19 earmarked resources. The US\$60million implicated in the
 COVID-gate scandal and part of the US\$796 675 embezzled by Dr Portia Managazira will, if recovered, go a long way to enhance the capacity of central hospitals to accommodate and save COVID-19
 patients and to increase COVID-19 vaccine stocks.
