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
D-19 RESOURCE TRACKER

OVERVIEW

Zimbabwe has been trying to mobilise resources to respond in the best way possible to the devastating social and economic effects of corona virus. The Zimbabwe COVID-19 resource tracker is a civil society initiative by ZIMCODD to keep track of all resources pledged, received and utilised by the government of Zimbabwe in the COVID-19 response. ZIMCODD notes with concern that accountability for these resources is equally important as the resources themselves. This tracker has been developed to strengthen transparency and accountability by the government on COVID-19 resources while empowering citizens with information to hold the government to account on allocation and utilisation of COVID-19 resources. The tracker is updated on a weekly basis to show pledges honoured, resources received and resources expended.

MAJOR CONCERNS

• Grand political corruption in Zimbabwe has continued to be the root cause for the socioeconomic challenges bedevilling the country. The alleged abuse of office, misappropriation of COVID-19 funds and politicisation of aid by public officials has resulted in the untold suffering for Zimbabweans in the wake of COVID-19 pandemic.

- · Zimbabwe's economic governance system has also been marred by the government's lack of political will to effectively deal with corruption. A case in point being the manner in which the government is handling the COVIDGATE scandal where political elites implicated have not been prosecuted.
- When the health sector is underfunded, it is the common man that suffers. Such is the case for Zimbabwe where citizens lament lack of prioritisation of the health sector in a context where COVID-19 cases are surging.
- The country's state of preparedness in terms of capacity and infrastructure of health institutions to manage COVID-19 cases coupled with the downing of tools by specialist and senior doctors is a major cause for concern.

RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE GOVERNMENT

• The government must expedite the implementation of the provisions of section 298 of the supreme constitution; article 5 of the United Nations Convention Against Corruption; and must strengthen anti-corruption bodies so as to curb grand political corruption.

Prosecution of those implicated, restitution and/or asset recovery is key in this exercise.

• The government must exercise transparency and accountability in the stewardship of resources earmarked for the fight against COVID-19.

This must include: Efficient, open and accountable procurement; Disclosure of beneficial owners of all companies awarded COVID-19 contracts.

• Prioritise, allocate and disburse funding to revamp the capacity and infrastructure of health institutions. This should include addressing the

key demands of the health personnel who are at the centre of the COVID-19 response.
